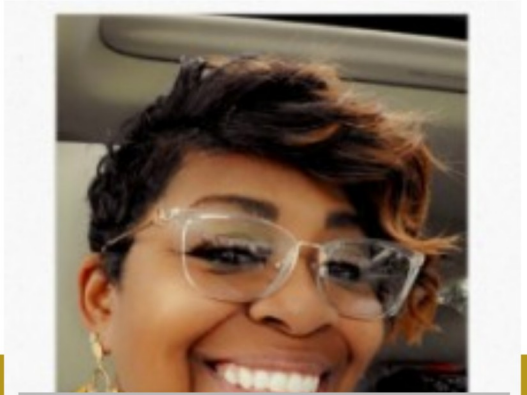

PROGRAMS

Admissions & Registration

ZFBC is an equal opportunity Christian educational institution which admits qualified applicants regardless of gender, ethnicity, age, handicap status, or veteran status.

A qualified applicant is described as a person who meets the following general admissions requirements along with the specific requirements for the program that he/she will pursue. The general admissions requirements are as follows:

1. Each applicant must be at least 18 years of age.
2. Each applicant must submit a high school transcript or GED to student records. The student's proof of graduation from a public, private or home high school that operates in compliance with state or local law may be submitted. Additional processes can be considered when an official transcript is not available.
3. Each applicant must have adequate means of paying his/her tuition and fees as ZFBC does not offer financial aid, grants, or student loans at this time. Payments plans are available to assist the student.

4. Each applicant must properly complete all required admissions paper work.
5. ZFBC gives credits for informal learning through significant life work and ministry experience when evaluating and placement of an applicant in a given program of study.
6. Each applicant must attend the student orientation.

Associates in Biblical Studies

The required path to a Bachelors of Theology degree begins with our associate's program. This two-year program form the basic curriculum of bible studies.

1. Each applicant must meet all general admissions requirements.
2. Upon completing all required course materials of the Associates Program or upon proof of adequate course equivalency, students may be enrolled in our Bachelors Program.

Bachelors of Arts in Theology

Educational Qualifications for Acceptance:

An applicant for a college-level degree must be a high school graduate or 10 be able to present a Certificate of Eligibility demonstrating successful completion of the General Education Development (GED) examination. An applicant to the college must be able to submit official transcripts indicating completed course work and degree(s) awarded for consideration of transfer credits.

General Education Requirements:

Those applicants seeking admission into a Bachelor of Theology Degree Program must follow all application guidelines. Transcripts of previous General Education courses must be submitted within ninety (90) days of enrollment and will be evaluated by the Registrar. Only those courses with grades C and above will be counted toward the credit requirements. The Registrar will evaluate any addition al academic credits acquired by the perspective student.

Prerequisite courses are offered and must be completed before starting the core subject areas. It is re quired that all courses, general and core are satisfactorily completed to start this program.

The Application—Registration Period:

ZFBC operates on a semester system so that applicants may apply and register during our year-round open registration process. Transfer credits will be considered only for those courses in which the student received a C or higher.

A student in process of completing a degree at another institution may take ZFBC courses as a non-matriculated student, pending completion of the degree from the other institution.

Upon receipt of official transcripts and verification of graduation. The student may begin a ZFBC Degree program and receive transfer credits for all previous work completed, assuming the courses meet ZFBC academic standards.

Masters of Arts in Christian Education and Masters of Arts in Christian Counseling

ZFBC now offers two distinct Masters Programs. They are: Masters of Arts in Christian Education and Masters of Arts in Christian Counseling.

Ordinarily, applicants for the degree will be required to:

1. Hold a Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.
2. Have earned a grade average of at least a B (3.0 on a 4.0 scale) in their Bachelor's program.
3. Submit two personal reference forms from close friends not related to you capable of assessing the applicants intellectual and academic ability and two letters of reference: one from a layperson that address the applicant's performance in his or her current position of ministry and one from an ordained minister addressing their spiritual and church life.
4. Submit a one-page essay that states the applicant's reasons for applying to the program.

This degree offers a distinctive opportunity for students to cultivate habits of a Christian worldview through theological reflections while engaging cutting edge interdisciplinary themes within ZFBC spiritual landscape.

Doctorate in Christian Ministry and Doctorate in Christian Education

Ordinarily, applicants for these two degrees will be required to:

1. Hold a Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.
2. Hold a Master's Degree or its equivalence from an accredited institution or approved institution.
3. Have spent at least five years in ministry.
4. Have earned a grade average of at least B (3.0 on 4.0 scale) in their master's program.
5. Submit two personal reference forms from close friends not related to you capable of assessing the applicant's intellectual and academic ability, and two letters of reference (one from an ecclesial official and one from a lay person) that address the applicant's performance in his or her current position of ministry.
6. Submit a two-page essay, describing their goals in undertaking doctoral studies including an indication of their proposed focus.

The Doctorate of Christian Ministry program is designed to promote rigorous and imaginative reflection on the practice of ministry and to enhance the critical skills of a person engaged in the leadership of congregations or church-related institutions.

The Doctorate of Christian Education is a professional doctorate that has been in ministry of theological education for decades, providing the opportunity for post-Master of Christian Education to pastors and other Christian leaders. A faith-based doctorate of education focuses on the application of educational theory, practice and leadership in an instructional setting (e.g. church, school, university, ministry organization, etc.). This degree affords an applicant the ability to:

- * Explore the intersection of faith and education from a Christian worldview
- * Prepare for specific PK-20 educational leadership positions in faith-based settings
- * Acquire practical skill-sets in administration (e.g. financial management, staff development, program development, etc.)
- * Gain expertise in policy-making, governance, and legal matters that apply to Christian institution
- * Foster collaborative cultures, community engagement, and servant leadership

Admissions and Registration

Non-Degree Seeking

Applicants entering ZFBC or any of its programs for spiritual and academic enrichment and who do not desire to obtain a degree must meet the following admissions requirements:

1. Each applicant must meet the general admissions requirements.
2. Each applicant must have a high school diploma or GED equivalent.

Audit Students Admissions

Persons who desire to enroll in a ZFBC course strictly for spiritual or academic enrichment and do not want the course to count toward a certificate or degree must meet the following criteria.

1. Each applicant must meet the general admissions requirements.
2. Each applicant must obtain approval from the Enrollment Specialist and the instructor prior to registering for course.
3. Each applicant must adhere to the guidelines set forth by the course instructor.

Transfer Credits:

Official transcripts must be submitted to the admissions office for preliminary evaluation during the administration process. At the Bachelors level, transfer credits will be considered only for those courses in which the student received a C or higher.

A student in the process of completing a degree at another institution may take ZFBC courses as a non-matriculated student, pending completion of the degree from the other institution.

Upon receipt of official transcripts and verification of graduation, the student may matriculate into a ZFBC degree program and receive transfer credits for all previous work completed, assuming the courses meet ZFBC academic standards.

Standard of Personal Conduct

ZFBC encourages a close and edifying relationship between faculty and students. The relationship will be one that will deepen the spiritual growth of each other. It is very important that the faculty, staff, and

Student discipline: All students are expected to conduct themselves to the highest Christian standards and the Standard of Personal Conduct.

Zoe Fellowship Bible College Graduation Requirements

NOTE: ALL balances must be paid in full before Graduation and before any transcripts are released.

ZFBC graduation is for students who are in good standing upon the Satisfactory Completion of all degree courses and requirements.

You will be granted an Academic Degree as follows:

Associate

Bachelor

Master

Doctorate

Students are subject to the degree requirements listed in our school booklet.

ZFBC holds a commencement exercise at the end of each semester (two graduations per year.) Students are expected to attend. In extreme cases of emergency, it will be necessary to notify in writing by email to the Dean of Academics Dr. Christopher Washington – deancwashington.zoe@gmail.com or call (980) 777-3641, Provost/VP, Dr. Lucille Spears – vpspears.zoe@gmail.com - or call (704) 706-0566 and COO, Dr. Lisa Brown – vpbrown.zoe@gmail.com at (704) 345 – 8445, prior to Graduation.

All students must pass their courses with a satisfactory GPA.

Attire for Graduation: Women: Black Dress, Blouses, Nude, Black or Coffee Pantyhose and Black shoes. Men: Black Slacks with White Dress Shirt and Tie, Dark Socks, Black Dress shoes..

PLEASE NOTE: Students are prohibited in wearing Jeans or Tennis Shoes at graduation!!

Graduation Packet (CAP & Gown) is PAID Separate from the ZFBC Tuition.

NOTE: If Transcripts are needed, please notify the Administrative Staff with contact information of the new school and it will be mailed to the College of your choice: BY MAIL ONLY!!!

ASSIGNMENT REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of one homework assignment will be required per course. Additional assignments may be given at the Professors discretion.

A minimum of five writing assignments, projects or presentation required.

All written assignments are a minimum 250 words typed in APA style, double spaced, and 12 inch font.

ALL assignments must be returned by email, in WORD FORMAT ONLY!! No Google Docs or PDF's will be accepted.

All online / virtual classes will be held via ZOOM. Every Teacher will send your syllabus at the start of every Semester with details of their Zoom Codes for you to join the Class.

Zoe Fellowship Bible College Academic Probation Policy

Supporting Students Toward Academic Success

Zoe Fellowship Bible College's academic probation program is structured and designed to support students whose academic performance falls below the College's required standards. This program aims to provide guidance, resources, and strategies to improve students' academic standing and achieve long-term success.

Understanding Academic Probation

Academic probation is typically a formal status assigned to students who fail to meet specific academic criteria, such as maintaining a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) or completing a required number of credits. This status acts as a warning and an opportunity for students to address the issues affecting their academic performance.

Criteria for Academic Probation

Zoe Fellowship Bible College establishes clear guidelines for placing students on academic probation. Common factors include:

- Falling below a minimum GPA threshold (often between 2.0 and 2.5).
- Failing to complete the required number of credits within a semester or academic year.
- Failing specific core or major-related courses.

Notification

- Students placed on academic probation will receive formal notification, including:

Reasons for probation.

Required steps to return to good standing.

Deadlines for meeting these requirements.

Duration of Probation

- Academic probation typically lasts for one semester or quarter, after which the student's performance will be reevaluated.

Outcomes

At the end of the probation period, one of the following outcomes will occur:

1. Return to Good Standing: Students will be removed from probation if they meet the required standards.
2. Continued Probation: If progress is made but standards are not fully met, probation may be extended.
3. Dismissal or Suspension: The student may be subject to academic dismissal or suspension if no significant progress is made.

Appeals

Students can appeal academic probation or dismissal decisions by submitting a formal appeal within a specified timeframe. The appeal should include:

- Reasons for the appeal.
- Supporting documentation (e.g., medical records, personal statements).
- An improvement plan.

Reinstatement

Dismissed students may apply for reinstatement after a specified period, provided they meet criteria such as:

- Completing coursework at another institution.
- Addressing the issues that led to poor performance.
- Demonstrating readiness to succeed academically.

Components of ZFBC Academic Probation

Zoe Fellowship Bible College's Academic probation program includes a combination of mandatory and optional resources to help students understand their challenges and develop strategies for improvement. Key components include:

Advising and Counseling
